Presentation of the New Releases Standing Order

At the start of the academic year 2019/2020, OpenEdition is launching a new service for libraries: the New Releases Standing Order.

With this new service you can offer your users **automatic access** to new releases from one or more collection(s) from the publishing houses you have selected. This makes it quicker to make new titles available.

- Titles are purchased permanently, with no DRMs and unlimited downloads of PDF and ePub formats.

Our publisher partners have committed to publish all new releases in digital format within three months of their print publication.

This new offer includes all high value-added [services](#) designed for libraries as part of the OpenEdition *Freemium* for Books offer (Counter statistics, Marc records, customized graphic design, etc.).

Terms and conditions

It is possible to choose one or more collections from each publishing house. The catalogue presents publishers and collections and for each collection indicates the number of titles to be published and the estimated purchase price per title.

The subscription form (Excel format) allows you to select collections. The estimated annual amount will be calculated automatically. The calculation is based on the number of titles planned by the publisher and the average book price in the collection(s) you have chosen.

In your subscription form,

1. Enable macros
2. In the "Catalogue" tab, enter 1 in front of the collections you have selected (column I)
3. Once your selection is complete, click on 'Confirm' and open the "Subscription Form" tab
4. This tab shows the selected collections and estimated annual amount. Fill in your institutional contact details
5. Click on 'Print the quote request', then 'Print'. Select 'Print PDF' (or equivalent).
6. Save your quote request (PDF) and submit it by email to library-support@openedition.org.

We will send you a quote with the applicable discounts. Your acceptance of this quote with discounts applied will validate your subscription.

If you are not yet a partner of the OpenEdition Freemium programme, you will need to submit a [form to open an account](#) in order to enable access.

- The books from the selected collections will be automatically opened to your users as soon as they are published online. You will receive a quarterly summary quotation before invoicing.

Information about pricing

- Average price before discount of a book: €46.55 exc. tax
- New Releases Standing Order discount: 5% or 10% (subscription to half of the collections on offer) or 15% (all collections) + country consortium discount + OpenEdition Freemium for Journals subscriber discount
- Quarterly invoicing
- Purchased titles automatically deducted from subsequent purchases (bundles or other)
